Economic Development in Pleasant Grove

Grove Tower- The Grove Tower is being constructed by St. John Properties just off of I-15 at the Pleasant Grove Blvd. Interchange. This office complex is just under 200,000 square feet of Class A office space. The Grove Tower will be six stories in height and is projected to open at the beginning of the new year. St. John Properties has already added two office buildings in The Grove and have plans to start constructing some retail space in the near future.

The VOID and Evermore Gardens- These two projects are being constructed on the northeast corner of the North County Blvd. and Pleasant Grove Blvd. The VOID will be a state-of-the-art virtual reality gaming center. Evermore Gardens will be a community gathering place with luscious gardens with individual plants available for retail sale.

ASEA- ASEA is a direct marketing company that sells their brand of water throughout the world. Their worldwide headquarters are being built in Pleasant Grove just east of Central Bank. Right now they are constructing 50,000 square feet of office space with a master plan to add another 100,000 square feet as their company continues to grow.

We are grateful that these companies have chosen to bring their business to Pleasant Grove. Not only are well paying jobs available to our residents, but they will also spawn further development in our community which could include places to shop and eat.

The City is also working with other companies that would like to locate in Pleasant Grove and we hope to have some announcements soon as growth continues to develop in our community.

Being "water wise" means conserving water as an individual, family, and community.

Here are 3 examples of our "water wise" tips for a greener, more healthy garden:

- Use Mulch: It prevents water evaporation and is a natural weed preventer.
- Use Trigger Sprayers: It makes hand watering easier and saves water.
- Use Compost: It decreases water usage which improves absorption and retention.
