- FIC AID 218 p. *An Assembly Such as This* by Pamela Aidan
Darcy’s perspective during his first visit to Herfordshire, from the disastrous ball at Netherfield to Darcy’s return to London.
- FIC ALB 197 p. *For One More Day* by Mitch Albom
Charley worships his father until he disappears. Decades later, Charley is a broken man when he is allowed one "ordinary" day with a chance to make good with a lost parent.
- FIC AND 210 p. *The Traveler’s Gift* by Andy Andrews
David finds himself seriously distraught and contemplating suicide. A car crash precipitates individual visits with seven historical notables.
- FIC BAL 401 p. *Wish You Well* by David Baldacci
In one terrifying moment Louisa Mae’s life is changed forever, and she and her brother leave New York for the mountains of Virginia.
- YA FIC BAU 186 p. *Hope Was Here* by Joan Bauer
Hope and her aunt work in a diner, and become involved with the owner’s political campaign to oust the town’s corrupt mayor.
- FIC BRE 330 p. *The Golden Urchin* by Madeleine Brent
A young Irish woman, raised by an aboriginal tribe, travels through the harsh Australian outback to discover her heritage and finds herself in Victorian society and the heiress to family wealth.
- FIC BUR 391 p. *Cold Sassy Tree* by Olive Ann Burns
When Grandpa Rucker suddenly marries his store’s young milliner barely three weeks after his wife’s death, the town is set on its ear.

When a new member of the Persian Pickle Club stirs up a dark secret, the women must band together to support and protect one another.

A family without men, the Birches live gloriously offbeat lives in the lush, green backwoods of North Carolina, headed by a remarkable matriarch who calls herself Charlie Kate.

Quaker pastor Sam Gardner wants to spend the rest of his life in his hometown of Harmony. He appreciates the hilarious quirks of human nature he finds there.

Miss Julia is bemused when Hazel Marie appears at her door with a youngster in tow and announces that the child is the illegitimate son of Miss Julia's late husband.

343 p. **I Capture the Castle** by Dodie Smith
Cassandra is the daughter of a once-famous author with a severe case of writer's block. Her family is barely scraping by in a crumbling English castle they leased when times were good.


