



NEW JUDGE APPOINTED

Mayor Guy Fugal has appointed Randy Birch to fill a vacancy as Judge in the Pleasant Grove Justice Court. Judge Birch will replace Judge Brent Bullock who retired after over 20 years of service.

Prior to his appointment to the Pleasant Grove bench he had served for over eight years as the Heber City Justice Court Judge, a position in which he will continue. Judge Birch has practiced law for over 35 years throughout Utah.

Judge Birch served as a small claims judge pro tem in the Third District from 1985 through 2010 and assisted in the preparation of the Small Claims Bench book. Birch has prepared and presented training materials for small claims judges for the Administrative Offices of the Court. Before his appointment to the bench he practiced law with the firms of Walstad & Babcock, Bertch & Birch and Bostwick & Price. He currently maintains a part-time solo law practice in Heber.

During his career, J Birch was a member of the Utah State Bar Ethics screening panel, and a board member of the Utah Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers. He received B.A. from Utah State, and his J.D. degree from the University of Utah.

We are honored to have Judge Birch join us and serve the citizens of Pleasant Grove.
