LETTER FROM THE CITY RECORDER

Dear Pleasant Grove Resident;

2019 is a Municipal Election year. Pleasant Grove City has 3 City Council Seats up for election.

Because there are more than (2) two candidates for each position Pleasant Grove City will be holding a Primary Election on Tuesday August 13, 2019. The General Election will be held on Tuesday November 5, 2019.

The City Council voted to authorize Utah County to conduct the 2019 Primary and General Municipal Elections by using Vote by Mail, a system where all registered voters use absentee (Vote by Mail) ballots to vote.

Registered voters are not required to fill out an application for the vote by mail ballot; each registered voter will be mailed a ballot and instructions for returning the ballot. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed out no sooner than 21 days before the election (Tuesday, July 23) and no later than 14 days before the election (Tuesday, July 30). Ballots for the General Election will be mailed out no sooner than 21 days before the election (Tuesday, October 15) and no later than 14 days before the election (Tuesday, October 22).

Since all ballots will be mailed out to each registered voter, it is important to make sure your voter registration is current. If you have changed your name or address (even if you have moved from one home to another within the city) you need to re-register. Please visit www.vote.utah.gov to register to vote (if you have a current Utah Drivers License or State ID Card) to update your voter registration.

If you have not received your ballot within two weeks after they are mailed, call the Utah County Elections Office (801) 851-8128. Your voter registration will be checked to ensure that the information is correct. If the address is correct, a replacement ballot will be sent. If your information has changed, your registration will need to be updated and a new ballot will be sent.

You may return your ballot in the following ways:

- Mail your ballot, postmarked no later than the day before the election.
- Drop off your ballot at any Voter Service Center in the County before 8 pm on Election Day.
- Drop off your ballot in the Drop Off Ballot Box on the north/east side of City Hall, 70 South 100 East.

There will be an “Election Day Service Center” in the Community Room at 108 South 100 East, for those that want to vote in person. Those wanting to vote in person will have to vote provisionally. The Center will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

EARLY VOTING

With Utah County conducting the Vote by Mail election, early voting will only take place at the Utah County Elections Office, 100 East Center Street Suite 3100 Provo UT 84606, from July 29th to August 12th; 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for the Primary Election.
